Classes enjoyed an amazing magic show from Mr. Stehr and a traditional Carrier story read by Mr. Patrick. In the afternoon, we explored different types of Indigenous homes and ate nah'w-ess, a traditional ice cream made from soap berries.

Report card will be coming home on Friday. Friday is also **Fun Day**—all classes will be outside in the morning, followed by a hot dog lunch and a movie in the afternoon.

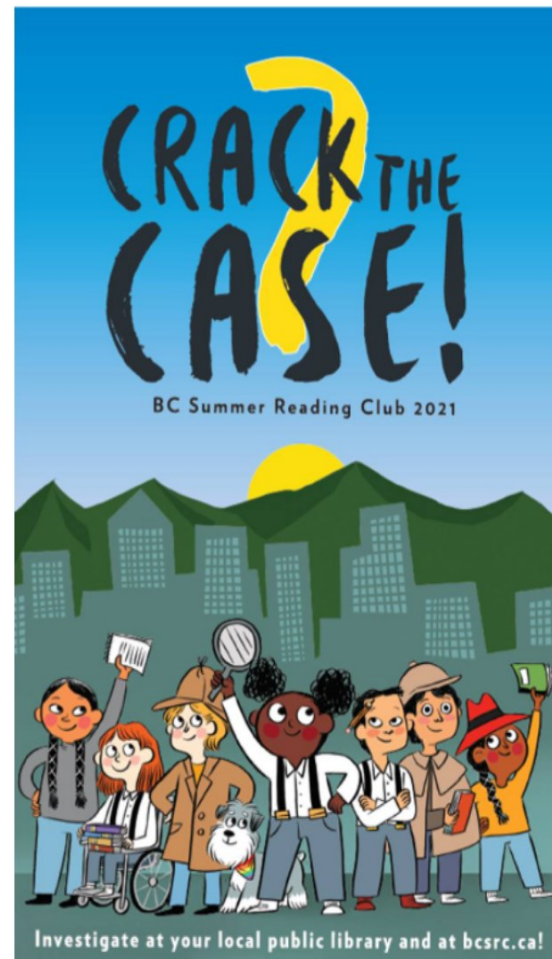
At the Board meeting on Monday, June 14, 2021, the following policies were given various readings:

The Fraser Lake Public Library invites children and families to participate in the many programs that are being held this summer. On Tuesdays from 10-11 a.m. the Summer Reading Club for ages 4-7 will be held and will include stories, crafts, and games. On Wednesdays from 10-11 a.m. the Evil Genius Club for ages 6-12 will be held and will focus on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics activities, such as, creating slime and building miniature catapults. On Thursdays from 10-11 a.m. the Summer Reading Club for ages 8-12 will be held and will consist of games, crafts, and activities that encourage reading. These programs will be held outdoors on the library grounds for health and safety reasons. On Fridays from 12-4 p.m. we will be at the Community Market where everyone is welcome to drop by and read a story or work on a craft.

These programs are designed to encourage reading during the summer months which aids in maintaining and improving literacy skills.
